- SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- This Act may be cited as the "Freedom for Ameri-4
- cans to Travel to Cuba Act of 2017".

- 16 (a) SAVINGS PROVISION.—Nothing in this Act may
 17 be construed to limit the authority of the President to re18 strict travel described in section 2, or any transaction inci19 dent to such travel, on a case-by-case basis, if the Presi20 dent determines that such restriction—
- (1) is necessary to protect the national security
 of the United States; or
- 23 (2) is necessary to protect the health or safety 24 of United States citizens or legal residents resulting 25 from traveling to or from Cuba.
